



In-Home Services

Skilled Nursing

A registered nurse case manager coordinates care with all other disciplines and the physician according to the patient's plan of care. Under the supervision of the registered nurse, licensed practical nurses provide nursing treatments that support the plan of care. Nurses coordinate comprehensive care in a variety of areas: pain management, medication instruction and management, surgical aftercare, infusion therapy, wound and ostomy care, incontinence and catheter care, anti-coagulation therapy, telehealth and home safety, nutrition and enteral therapy. HHU also offers disease management and self care of chronic conditions. A Pediatric Nurse Practitioner provides specialty care for newborns and young children.

Medical Social Services

After a patient is admitted to home health services, a medical social worker may come to the home and conduct a thorough psychosocial assessment to help determine patient needs and identify any limitations, barriers, or safety issues that might impede recovery. Social workers educate patients and families regarding community resources, support, long range planning including advance directives, and overall care options.

Community Resource Program (CRP)

Home Health United's Community Resource Program provides a free medical social worker consultation to anyone facing these challenges: chronic health condition; frequent hospitalizations and ER visits; trouble with pain control; frequent falls or; need to make the home safer. Call 1-800-900-8040 and a medical social worker will contact you to provide information on available options at HHU and in the community. If needed, they will schedule a free in-home health informational visit.

Occupational Therapy

Occupational therapists assess a patient's ability to perform daily tasks; determine hindrances to independence and develop programs that help restore function. An occupational therapist may teach patients and caregivers strategies for improving independence; treatment of incontinence; initiate a home exercise program; recommend adaptive equipment or make environmental modifications. They also conduct home safety evaluations and can assess patients' cognitive abilities; impaired vision as it relates to daily living and safety; and their supervision needs.

Physical Therapy

Physical therapists assess a patient's musculoskeletal system focusing on safety and mobility; educate patients and caregivers; develop home exercise programs; assess need for assistive devices; and provide specialized individual care. They also work on treatment of incontinence; wound care; pain management; and fall risk reduction, through recommendations on safety and balance training.

Speech Therapy

Speech/Language pathologists assess patients' communication abilities and help improve their ability to communicate; work on improving swallowing skills; teach compensatory strategies to reduce the risk for aspiration and other complications; and help patients maintain good nutrition and hydration.

Home Health Aides

Under the supervision of a registered nurse, home health aides assist with: bathing, skin care, oral hygiene, nail care, home exercise program, ambulation, simple wound care, bowel program, catheter care, and light meal preparation.

Infusion

HHU Infusion Pharmacy is a licensed pharmacy that provides IV medications, nutritional support, infusion pumps, supplies and comprehensive infusion therapy management to patients in their own homes. All of our patients are served by our state-of-the-art sterile compounding pharmacy. Therapies commonly provided include antibiotics, immune globulin, pain management, and enteral and parenteral nutrition.

Home Telemonitoring

The Honeywell® HomMed Health Monitoring System is a hospital-grade medical device that collects patient vital signs daily, providing patients with a secure and consistent connection to HHU clinicians. If information collected indicates a need for intervention, or if the user fails to collect vital signs when prompted, appropriate action is taken and members of the care team may be contacted.

Meals on Wheels

Home Health United - Meals on Wheels delivers nutritious meals to homebound individuals who live in Madison, Middleton and Monona every day of the year. Many recipients live alone and benefit from the personal contact and safety check provided by Meals on Wheels volunteers.

The volunteers deliver a daily newspaper along with the meal that can be prepared for special dietary needs such as diabetic, renal, cardiac, soft, vegetarian or gluten-free. *Madison, Monona, Middleton only.





Hospice

Hospice is a special type of care for people who are facing serious illness and who have a limited life expectancy. Home Health United - Hospice provides a care team consisting of nurses, social workers, spiritual counselors, home health aides, volunteers and medical directors. The team works closely with patients and families to identify their goals and priorities, and to develop a plan to achieve those. The services are provided wherever the patient calls home, which could be a relative's home, nursing home, assisted living facility, or hospital.

In-Home Hospice Services

Hospice care in the home includes skilled nursing, physician oversight, medical social services, home health aides, grief support, spiritual counseling, volunteers, and physical, occupational, and speech therapy.

Residential Services

St. Clare Hospice House Residential facility - HHU staffs and manages the operation of the Hospice House including: meals, medication administration, laundry, and housekeeping to meet the needs of the patient and family. Patients also benefit from all in-home hospice services.



Community Health Services

Immunizations

Home Health United provides influenza vaccination clinics at work sites and to the public. Public clinics include senior centers, libraries, churches, Community Based Residential Facilities (CBRF), adult day care centers and assisted living facilities.

Corporate Wellness

Home Health United professionals enhance the health of employees at work sites by offering a variety of wellness programs. These programs include Hepatitis B vaccinations, tuberculosis testing, blood pressure evaluation and cholesterol screening.

Foot Care Clinics

Home Health United provides foot care clinics in both public and private settings. A technician can perform nail trimming and care at senior centers, churches, assisted living facilities and in a client's private residence. Nurses are also available to perform diabetic foot care at public clinics or in the home.

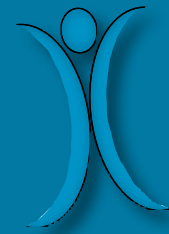

Retail stores have an in-stock supply of home medical equipment and supplies to assist patients and caregivers with treatments and care; and to increase mobility, safety, independence and comfort. Knowledgeable Assistive Technology Suppliers are available at each location to assist in product selection.

Mobility Aids-Wheelchairs, Walkers, Scooters

Whether the need is temporary or lasting, HHU has many options to help maintain mobility, from folding wheelchairs to complex power wheelchairs.

Oxygen & Respiratory Therapy Services

HHU has an extensive network of knowledgeable respiratory therapists, technicians, and customer service staff providing state-of-the-art respiratory technologies and support therapy including: oxygen, continuous positive airway pressure, apnea monitors, sleep studies and ventilators.

Continuous Positive Airway Pressure (CPAP)

If a physician has ordered CPAP therapy for sleep apnea, HHU respiratory therapists function as a support person and liaison between the patient and physician who will provide instruction on use and maintenance of CPAP and supplies. During the first month, HHU will call the patient weekly at no charge to discuss issues and answer questions.

Patient Room and Home Safety Equipment

HHU can provide hospital equipment that patients need to remain in the home including multi-positional hospital beds; hoist and other patient lifts; lift chairs; specialized mattresses and accessories for pressure sore reduction; overbed tables; bath and toilet aids, wound, ostomy and medical supplies; home sleep products; and trapeze and traction equipment.

Aids for Daily Living

HHU has an array of personal care items including reachers, adaptive utensils, long handled shoehorns and elastic shoelaces.
